Competence Management System

CMS Overview

The overall aim of the Competence Management System (CMS) standard is compliance with the Environmental Permit and to support environmental protection. The competence of people at each level and across the organisation whose work affects this protection is essential.

A competence management system enables operators to demonstrate that they have the 'technical competence' required to satisfy regulatory requirements and comply with the environmental permit for waste activities.

Requirements for CMS

CMS is a management system based standard developed by Energy & Utility Skills and approved by Defra, SEPA, the EA, the Welsh Government and Natural Resources Wales as a method of demonstrating technical competence of permitted waste sites. It can be used by any company, within any industry, who is required to demonstrate technical competence for their environmental permit.

The standard specifies requirements for a competence management system to enable an organisation to develop and implement a policy and objectives which take into account legal requirements and compliance with the environmental permit. The success of the system depends on commitment from all levels and functions of the organisation.

The implementation of an effective CMS helps you drive environmental improvements across your organisation. Features include:

 Integrates with existing management systems such as environment, occupational health & safety, and quality management systems, or can be used as a standalone management system
